United Presbyterian Church was officially recognized as a member of STREAM (Stronger Together Reaching Equity Across Manatee) at its gathering last December. This organization has a focus on social justice issues and the response of people of faith based in part on Nehemiah 5:1-13. Nehemiah and his contemporary Ezra, were appointed by the Persian ruler to bring the Jewish exiles back to Jerusalem. Ezra, a prophet, focused his efforts on the rebuilding of the Temple, while Nehemiah's work concentrated on the rebuilding of the walls of the city. One was a prophet and the other a public servant.

STREAM attempts to bridge both arenas in its work. We cannot be concerned solely with spiritual welfare but must also address physical and societal welfare issues too. It is good to pray for those in need; but prayers must be accompanied by actions that aid those in need.

There have been three primary areas of concern adopted by this organization: mental health issues of youth; the housing that is affordable for lower income individuals and families; and pre-arrest diversion programs for those who face harsh penalties for minor crimes. Each of these areas of concern are overwhelming so participants in STREAM are encouraged to focus on one area.

I was able to attend a virtual meeting with a deputy superintendent of the Manatee County Schools in mid-January concerning the area of mental health of children and youth. I am encouraged by the efforts of the Administration to address these topics but it is abundantly evident that there are more needs than resources to meet them. Yet we are called to persevere in our efforts to work on solutions and ways to meet the needs. I have lots to learn about this topic and was grateful to hear the wisdom and experiences of many people who have served as teachers, school counselors and social workers. Prayers are needed and necessary; actions are vital to our work in this area.

I hope to have additional opportunities to learn and to work with others at STREAM on ways to influence policies and support decisions by our School Board and State leaders to address the crisis we face not only in our schools but throughout our greater community.

If you are interested in being part of our church's team of STREAM'ers please let me know. The next Nehemiah Action event is scheduled for Monday, March 31.



- Reactivated the former memberships of Michael and Kathleen Craig into United and approved the transfers of Dick and Daphne Ann Haynes to Peace Presbyterian and Burt Tupper to First Church-Sylva, NC.
- Approved an updated Manual of Administrative Operations for United Presbyterian.
- Set Sunday, February 23rd as the date for the Annual Meeting of the church and for the Corporation.
- Approved the purchase of an Apple Mini-Mac computer and monitor to replace outdated equipment and facilitate sound mixing and streaming of worship services.
- Approved transition to a new website for United Presbyterian (upchurchbradenton.org).
- Approved the operating budget for 2025.
- Elected Ron Dickerson to a two-year Term on the Church Nominating Committee in the Class of 2026.
- Approved the church's Annual Statistical Report for submission to Presbytery.
- Approved the Presbytery's new Antiracism Policy for adoption by United and incorporation into the Employee Handbook.
- Endorsed the creation of a small group to explore additional ways to meet the goal of reducing our carbon footprint 25% by mid-2026. All interested members are invited to participate in this study under the leadership of Ron Dickerson.

- In accordance with church Bylaws, elected Roy Williams as Clerk and Sherri Kramer as Treasurer for 2025.

December and January was a busy time of fun and events that helped share the love of the season with many people. The new year brings us more opportunities to reach out to others in our community and world:

December & January Outreach Highlights:

- You shopped for and filled 20 bags of food for our 12 Days of Christmas collection to benefit families in need at Our Daily Bread's Loaves & Fishes food pantry.
- \$1,105 was collected for Presbyterian Mission Agency's Christmas Joy Offering.
- You brightened the lives of the residents of Brookdale Palma Sola by hosting a Christmas Caroling, Cookies and Cocoa event there this holiday season.
- You donated \$1,000 each to Habitat for Humanity and Our Daily Bread to help with hurricane recovery expenses.
- From the proceeds of our Cookie Exchange, you were able to help purchase and wrap over 300 pairs of socks that were gifted to clients of Our Daily Bread on Christmas Eve.
- You hosted a Candy Cane Carnival event for neighborhood children and families providing games, crafts, food, and fun during the Christmas season.
- Folks volunteered every Friday at Our Daily Bread.
- Proceeds of the Dreyer Trust blessed many families with the gift of assistance, helping with the costs of healthcare, utilities and rent for a total of \$47,909 this year.
- You assembled 4300 packages of okra seeds to support agricultural programs all over the world through Hope Seeds.
- You donated MANY egg cartons to help Mision Peniel distribute eggs to families they serve in their local community.

will be available in the Narthex to check out during the month of February. Read a book... restore hope, be inspired, learn methods, and be able to share your knowledge with family and friends.

Another Kingdom: Departing the Consumer Culture, by Peter Block, Walter Brueggemann, and John McKnight, 2016. Our belief in competition, scarcity, and acquisition are producing too many casualties. We need to depart a kingdom that creates isolation, polarized debate, and an exhausted planet. We need a new way that depends upon a neighborly covenant—an agreement that we together will better raise our children, be healthy, be connected, be safe, and provide livelihoods. Recommended in a Presbyterians for Earth Care webinar.

Nature's Best Hope: A New Approach to Conservation that Starts in Your Yard, by Douglas W. Tallamy, 2019. Tallamy outlines his vision for a grassroots approach to conservation. Nature's Best Hope shows how homeowners everywhere can turn their yards into conservation corridors that provide wildlife habitats. It's practical, effective, and easy—you will walk away with specific suggestions you can incorporate into your own yard.

Our Earth, Our Species, Our Selves. How to Thrive While Creating a Sustainable World, by Ellen Moyer, 2017. This book shows how with determination and action, we can implement solutions rather than sit on the sidelines suffering harmful impacts. We can have better health, a cleaner environment, a stable climate, healthy ecosystems, sustainable use of resources, and less need for damage control if we adopt a high-tech and high-nature way of life.

Rooted & Rising: Voices of Courage in a Time of Climate Crisis, edited by Leah Schade and Margaret Bullitt-Jonas, 2019. This book is for everyone who worries about the climate crisis and seeks spiritual practices and perspectives to renew their capacity for compassionate, purposeful, and joyful action. Essays by twenty-one faith leaders, scientists, community organizers, theologians, and grassroots climate activists offer wisdom. Recommended in a Presbyterians for Earth Care webinar.

Saving Us: A Climate Scientist's Case for Hope and Healing in a Divided World, by Katharine Hayhoe 2022. Called "one of the nation's most effective communicators on climate change" by The New York Times, evangelical Christian Katharine Hayhoe negotiates distrust of data, indifference to imminent threats, and resistance to proposed solutions with ease. She argues that when it comes to changing hearts and minds, facts are only one part of the equation. We need to find shared values in order to connect our unique identities to collective action. *Recommended in Christian Century magazine*.

The Future of Earth, A radical Vision for What's Possible in the Age of Warming, by Eric Holthaus, 2020 Harper One. This book shows readers how to reverse the short- and long-term effects of climate change over the next three decades. Hopeful and prophetic, it invites us to imagine how we can do this in our own lifetime and encourages us to enter a deeper relationship with the earth as conscientious stewards and re-affirm our commitment to one another.

We're Forming a Team to Further Reduce Our Carbon Footprint



This year we begin new efforts to reduce our carbon footprint. In the last 2 years, the replacement of three old HVAC systems with new high-efficiency models has resulted in energy savings of 10%.

Our goal is to reduce our carbon footprint another 15% by mid 2026 to meet the PC(USA) General Assembly 2022 resolution calling on all its organizations and congregations to reduce their carbon footprint 25% in 4 years.

A team of four is being formed to review Energy Star and Faith Power and Light online workbooks, designed to help churches lower their carbon footprint, and make recommendations for how to use them. These resources assist in identifying what actions to take and tracking the results of those actions. This team effort is expected to span one to two months.




